



Seal of Biliteracy

According to the Illinois State Board of Education, the State Seal of Biliteracy “recognizes public high school graduates who have attained a high level of proficiency in one or more languages in addition to English.”

State legislation requires public colleges and universities to accept the State Seal of Biliteracy as equivalent to two years of foreign language coursework taken in the high school which translates to Heartland Community College as the second semester foreign language course for four credits. The State Seal of Biliteracy will be recognized only from a state approved Illinois high school.

Students must request credit by submitting this form along with an official high school transcript/State Seal of Biliteracy document to the Records Office (CCB 1600); credit is not processed automatically upon receipt of the high school transcript. Students must submit the form within three years of graduating from high school in order to be granted credit.
